

STEPHEN MINISTRY

Stephen Ministry is a one-on-one, confidential ministry focused on listening, caring, and providing support during life's challenges. When you need someone that is not quite as close to the situation you are in, a Stephen Minister can be there as a third party who will listen with no judgment toward you, your situation, or others involved in your situation, you meet with your Stephen Minister once a week for an hour. Stephen Ministers are placed with a care receiver of the same gender and you are your Stephen Minister's only care receiver. Care receivers may be going through challenges such as:

- Divorce
- Illness
- Terminal illness of a loved one
- Spiritual confusion or frustration
- Caregiving
- Empty nest adjustments
- Forgiveness issues
- New baby
- A significant loss
- Othe life changes

In addition, there are other services, such as, GriefShare, Divorce Care, and Healing is a Choice.

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

KEY SCRIPTURE

¹²Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. ¹⁴Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.

¹⁵Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁶And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁷If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he

wanted them to be. ¹⁹If they were all one part, where would the body be? ²⁰As it is, there are many parts, but one body.





Church History TIMELINE



- Pentecost from Acts 2
- Council at Jerusalem (Acts 15) established precedent for addressing church disputes in Council
- Book of Revelation probably written
- **313** Constantine, western Roman emperor, used his power to address the status of Christians, issuing the Edict of Milan which legalized Christianity
- The Council of Nicea, first of Seven Ecumenical church-wide councils, settled the major heretical challenge on the humanity of Christ
- Separation of church, which created the Roman Catholic and the Eastern Orthodox faiths, the largest denominations in Christianity



Orthodox Church

- **1095** The Crusades began between Christians and Muslims to secure control of holy sites considered sacred by both groups
- 1382 John Wycliffe translated the entire Bible to English
- **1517** Martin Luther nailed his 95 Thesis to the door of the Church in Wittenberg, starting the Protestant Reformation
- 1524 William Tyndale published the New Testament
- 1671 The King James version of the Bible was printed
- **1739** Methodism movement began, which sought to reform the Church of England, but eventually, started a denomination
- 1787 African Methodist Episcopal Church began in Philadelphia

STORY TOLD BY JOHN WIMBER, AMERICAN PASTOR

He was greeting parishioners in church and a man approached him and told him he'd been contacted by somebody in great need. As he relayed his frustration in trying to get help for this needy person, he complained, "The man needed a place to stay, food, and support until he gets on his feet and finds a job. I'm really frustrated. I tried calling the church office, but no one could see me, and they couldn't help me. I finally ended up having to let him stay with me for the week. Don't you think the church should take care of people like this?' John Wimber replied, "It looks like the church did. Because you are the church. Every time you feed the hungry, that's the church doing it. Every time you visit the sick or visit someone in prison, that's the church. Every time you share Jesus, that is an extension of the Church. We, as believers in Christ, are the Church. Not a building or the staff that work at the Church. We are the Church."

WHAT ARE SACRAMENTS AND WHAT DO THEY MEAN FOR US?



Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of

the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?"


THE SACRAMENTS ARE A MEANS OF EXPERIENCING GOD'S GRACE.

- 2. When we celebrate communion, we remember God's love and grace upon us.
